

| JANUARY | FEBRUARY | MARCH | APRIL | MAY | JUNE |
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| Winter Clean-Up (late January – February) Remove any debris (branches, sticks, leaves) from turf and landscape beds Cut back ornamental grasses (not shorter than 3” from soil to protect crown) Cut back Liriope – this can be done by hand or with a push lawnmower set to the tallest height Cut back any browned-out foliage from perennials Structural pruning for roses to remove dead, diseased, and crossing branches | | Spring Clean-Up (any time from late March through early May, weather dependent) Apply pre-emergent weed control and fertilizer to turf (this will need to be done in early to mid March) Pull weeds Remove winter debris from beds Cut back any bulb foliage that has browned out Install fresh coat of mulch (finished depth not greater than 3”) Prune evergreen shrubs for shape Prune back Azaleas for shape, if needed (prune only immediately AFTER blooming) Apply broadleaf weed control to turf (can be done twice, once in April and once in May) | | | |
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| JULY | AUGUST | SEPTEMBER | OCTOBER | NOVEMBER | DECEMBER |
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| Mid-Summer Clean-Up (July) Apply Crabgrass control to turf, if necessary Trim back dead flower heads from blooming perennials and shrubs to encourage re-bloom Pull weeds Prune evergreen shrubs for shape, as needed | | | Fall Clean-Up (late October through early December, weather dependent) Cut back any perennials with foliage that has browned out Pull weeds Remove any debris Top-dress any areas of mulch that have thinned out or washed away Aerate and overseed turf areas | | |
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
